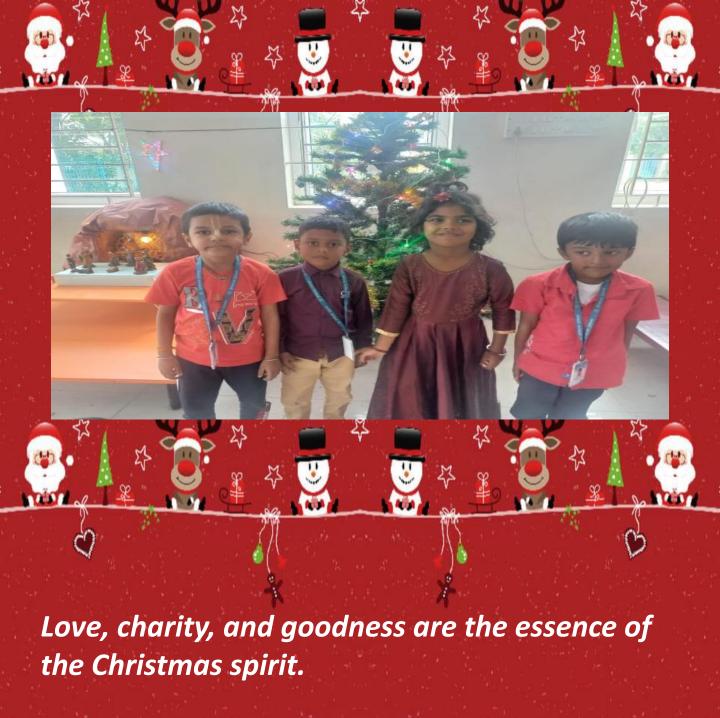
## CLASS UKG - CREATIVE LEARNING
