

TRIUMPH OF LIGHT OVER DARKNESS











The Director Ms Sindhura Arvind in her address encouraged students to dream big and work hard. She also appreciated the teachers for their lively performance.




PREPARATION AND MATERIALS











FRACTIONS ON PIZZA







FRACTIONS ON PIZZA

REACHED FOR THE STARS


